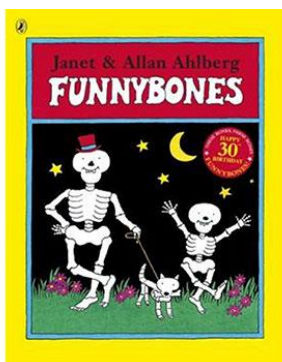


Year 1 Newsletter Term 4
