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#### **CURRICULUM AT NOVA**

Term 5 is to be filled full of interesting learning, focusing on children learning valuable scientific and geographical enquiry skills through their topics, including comparing, sorting, classifying, describing and researching. Children's learning will centre around the topic of plants and animals, investigating questions such as 'Which are stronger – plants or animals?', 'Could you survive in a rainforest?' and 'Could you live a bug's life?'

There are also some exciting experiences planned for the children including trips to Noah's Ark and Bristol Zoo, as well as having some special guest speakers visiting the school!

Classes aim to tweet photos and information about what has been happening so keep your eyes peeled to find out what's happening in class.

Here are some examples of how classes have launched their topics:

**Year R** Wallace and Gromit welcomed some very special visitors this week! 10 eggs were delivered and 9 have already hatched into baby chicks. We've loved watching them and can't wait to see how they grow. We've already learnt a lot about how to care for chicks and what we need to do to keep them safe.



**Year 2** children were curious about what they'd find on their mini beast hunt and they were not disappointed!







**Year 3** discussed animals and plants, sharing their knowledge and ideas for what they'd like to find out. Then, Mr Kilcoyne produced some animals to look at - grasshoppers, brown crickets and mealworms. What fun!
