

#### **The Nova Councils**

Well done to everyone who took part. Standing up and presenting is a real skill and one which will be of great benefit in years to come for all these children. Some of the school council members are already in action, helping with the prospective parent meetings.



Our Year 5 classes are involved in a wonderful project called, 'The Art of Being Brilliant.' The project develops belief in yourself and an understanding of how you are responsible for your happiness, well being and purpose in life. The facilitators visited school this week and will be in again next week. Below is what the Year 5 children learnt and thought about the day.

"During the Art of Brilliance we have learned a lot about being positive and enjoying life as we get 4000 weeks in our life. To be happy, you have to choose to be happy – it's one of the rules, 'Choose to be happy and take personal responsibility.' Apparently, only 2% of the population live every day being happy, therefore we are aiming to be among the 2%ers and not be a mood hoover (someone who hoovers up happiness because they are always in a bad mood). During the day we wrote down what we want our teacher to write in our school report next year so we have to be positive and happy to reach our goal. We learnt about HUGG which stand for Huge Unbelievable Great Goals and that it isn't gold at the end of the rainbow but happiness. I have really enjoyed the Art of Brilliance."

The facilitators were pretty impressed with our children too and are looking forward to next week.

#### **Library books**

We are extremely fortunate to have a wonderful library in school which the children visit on a weekly basis. They really enjoy being able to select a nonfiction book that interests them and share it at home. Library books are scanned out using the barcode and we ask that the book is taken to and from school in the child's book bag to protect it. Please keep it in a safe place whilst at home.

We have spent over £5000 stocking this library and are not in a position to replace books that are lost. If a library book or a home reader is lost we will have to charge you in order to replace it. The fee will be a minimum of £3, but it will depend on the value of the book. However, before we do this we will have a book amnesty. This gives you the opportunity to hunt for any library or home reading books up until the October holidays. After the break, letters will be sent out detailing the cost that needs to be repaid. Please get book hunting.

#### **HARVEST**

We will be celebrating Harvest again this year and collecting tins and packets of food. Our donations will go to the north Bristol Food Bank. Next week you will receive a shopping list of possible items to donate. Please send your gifts into school over the next two weeks. One of the best things in the M-Shed is the map of Bristol on the floor. It took us quite a while to find the school and our own houses.'
