concerns using an online tool that allows us to quickly share information and the actions we have taken.

Sometimes of course, the children need support in keeping themselves safe, particularly at playtimes for our youngest children. Rob, our Learning Mentor and the Leadership Team have been looking for ways to reduce the number of bumps, scrapes and tears that tend to occur. We have invested in new games equipment and chalkboards, which should arrive soon, and have increased supervision. Mrs Thorpe and I have been teaching the children playground games and rhymes and it is amazing how much they enjoy old favourites such as 'Creepmouse' and 'Ring-a- ring of Roses'.

We have also introduced Key Stage One assemblies. Each one is led by a different teacher, who will introduce through stories and songs, a goal for the children to work on for the following week and beyond.

On another safety related topic, you may have noticed the expandable zig zags we have started placing outside the school. Many of you comment on the unsafe parking and driving outside the school and I felt strongly that we had to be more proactive in protecting our children. It is an expense we could have done without, but the thought of a child being injured (or worse) is just too awful, as I am sure you

CURRICULUM AT NOVA

Term 4 has been full of interesting history learning, with children learning valuable historical enquiry skills through their topics. Children have been asking curious

questions and researching to find out about the lives of people through the ages including the Ancient Greeks, Ancient Egyptians, Romans and World War

2. Children have also been finding out about significant historical figures such as Queen Elizabeth and Florence Nightingale, producing some superb writing and artwork through this.

Classes aim to tweet photos and information about what has been happening, but here are a few examples of what the children have been up to:

Year 1 have been finding out all about our bodies. We explored our different senses and thought about how our bodies take information from our environment. We listened to things we could hear around us, explored different objects while blindfolded and investigated different things that smelt. Our favourite part was exploring our sense of taste. We tried a range of different foods with different textures both sweet, savoury and even sour.





Year 2 went to Tyntesfield House last week to learn about what life was like in Victorian times. Children had the chance to dress up in Victorian clothes, experience writing on a slate board, carry out jobs completed by servants and explore Victorian artefacts. It was a fantastic day and Year 2 were exemplary role models for Nova Primary School.





Year 3 took part in a picture book day based on a book named 'Journey' by Aaron Becker. With fantastic illustrations and no writing at all, every child had a different picture and was challenged to invent their own version of the story. We filmed them doing this and combined their descriptions together to create our very own class Journey! They have also been terrific unicorns by showing their imagination on World book day. They did not let the snow distract them when they created their fantastic shoe box creations based on their favourite books.





Year 4 were fortunate enough to have a free educational visit to the SS Great Britain on Tuesday. We had 2 fantastic tour guides who made learning about the ship fun even if the rats in the galley scared us!

We also had the chance to go down to the dry dock right under the ship and we visited the museum where we dressed in clothes from the Victorian era.
