CURRICULUM AT NOVA

This year we have launched our new Nova 'LEARN' Curriculum with new exciting line of enquiries to explore throughout the year. You can find more information about our Nova curriculum on our school website at http://novaprimaryschool.co.uk/learning/curriculum/

'Lessons from the past' is the theme for terms 1 and 2 so that each year group can develop their historical knowledge and skills. Staff have worked hard to plan meaningful and memorable learning opportunities for the children.

Year 1 have been busy learning about the people who help us now (firefighters, police and nurses). We are now focusing on people who have helped us in the past. Our main focus over the next few weeks is Florence Nightingale. Year 1 received a letter asking them to help a Museum gather as many facts about her as possible. We have also been learning about our bodies and how we keep them healthy.

Here are some pictures of us working together to label the parts of our body (e.g. head, arms, legs)





Year 2 children have been singing and playing 'London's Burning' and have enjoyed writing a news report called 'The Great Fire of Nova'!



As part of our time travelling journey, **Year 3** have now landed in Ancient Egypt. We have learnt about mummification and put this into practice by mummifying a tomato. We have been achieving our personal best and developing quality through editing in our writing. Here are some detailed and informative instructions on how to mummify. Amazing writing!



Year 4 have been learning about what life was like for the Romans. Children have made their own shields, designed and tested catapults to discover which would propel objects the furthest and they wrote their own non-chronological reports based on gladiators and Roman life.



Year 5 have been learning about Viking traditions. They have created art work based on Viking beliefs, made tasty Viking snacks and created Viking trinkets from clay to ward off evil! They have also been writing instructions on how to make a hero's weapon.








Year 6 have read the wordless book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan and produced writing in role as a 'Windrush generation' migrant. Our children have produced superb artwork, using pencil and collage on the theme of migration.

On Thursday 25th October 2018, 60 Year 6 children from Nova Primary will be spending the day on board MV Balmoral, working with Bristol-based Education Services provider My Future My Choice and Bristol Community Radio Station, Ujima Radio. Historic England will attend and have consulted on the project. The day will be the culmination of this term's Year 6 topic 'Whose footsteps do we follow in?'

Learning Committee


