Our poster tells children about the '3Ds'-Decide (is it an accident, an unpleasant incident or bullying?), Discuss (talk to a trusted adult- don't bottle things us) and Do (work with the adults to make things better). The children seem to like the 3Dsthey are easy to remember and can be applied to many situations. Please do look out for the posters around the school.

We have made a huge amount of headway with referrals and other actions, and we are organising the recruitment of a new SENCO at the moment. CURRICULUM AT NOVA

This term we have launched our new exciting line of enquiries to explore throughout terms 3 and 4. 'Making a difference' is the overarching theme so that each year group can develop their scientific, design and performance skills, making products

and outcomes that make a real difference. Parents in all year groups will be invited in to share in children's learning in this line of enquiry and we will keep you posted of dates in advance.

Reception are currently busy learning through their 'Dinosaur' topic! They have been recording news reports, painting pictures and writing posters to display around the school.

Year 1's line of enquiry is 'How can we make traditional tales come to life?'

We have been learning all about The Three Little Pigs. Children have story mapped and adapted the original story to create their own exciting narratives. We have also been experimenting with a range of different materials to test which would be the best to build new houses out of. Year 1 have been exploring the properties of materials and sorting them independently. Even more work has been done to unpick the story of the Three Little Pigs with designing new maps and giving each other instructions to explore the character's village - but beware of that Big Bad Wolf. I wonder what traditional tale will be next?





Year 2's line of enquiry is 'What makes Bristol brilliant?'


Last week Year 2 children visited the Clifton suspension bridge on their school trip to build up their historic knowledge of this iconic Bristol bridge. They have been building their own bridges as well as writing super fact files about Brunel.





Year 3 's line of enquiry is 'How can science educate and entertain us?'

We have been learning about the work of famous scientists including James Dyson, Isaac Newton and Tierra Fletcher. We have used our knowledge to write a scientific biography book to show to the scientists at 'We the Curious' on our trip!




Year 4's line of enquiry is 'Could you put on a stage show?'

In Year 4 we have been writing amazing descriptions based on our class book 'The Tinderbox'. We have also been investigating how shadows are made and change in science and will use this knowledge to help us make a shadow puppet show.



Year 5's line of enquiry is 'How have the Ancient Greeks influenced us?'

We have been learning about the influence Ancient Greeks have had on us, including philosophy and asking 'big questions'. In our RE enquiry day, we had deep and thoughtful discussions that blew our teachers away! We also created wonderful 'religious metaphor' artwork.



Year 6's line of enquiry is 'What was it like to grow up during WW2?'

Year 6 are writing poetry inspired by the world war images created by poet, Wilfred Owen. We used Padlet to collate effective and impactful vocabulary for our work. In science, we have been investigating circuits and applying this to WWII scenarios eg. how to make an air-raid siren buzz more, or less loudly. We also have a visit from Michael Gorely from National Heritage planned who will explain how and why Avonmouth was partially devastated during the war.





Of course, we always welcome parent/carer helpers - you may have a skill or interest that could really enhance the children's learning and we would love to hear from you.


Experience:

School Meals Supervisory Assistant Vacancy
