#### **CURRICULUM AT NOVA**

This term we have launched our new exciting Line of Enquiries to explore throughout terms 5 & 6. 'What a wonderful world!' is the overarching theme where children across the school will be developing their geographical and scientific skills and knowledge in particular as well as developing an appreciation of the diversity of life. Parents in all year groups will be invited in to share in children's learning in this Line of Enquiry and we will keep you posted of dates in advance.

Year R - Early Years have had a brilliant term learning lots about different animals! We have been lucky enough to have chicks visit our classrooms for two weeks of the term! We observed them closely, looked at their similarities and differences, and learned about their life-cycle - and we got to give them a cuddle too! We loved this learning and are now looking at different creatures; we are observing some tadpoles in the class, and have even done some pond-dipping to look at their habitat!







Year 1's Line of Enquiry is 'Why is water precious?'

Year 1 children have been busy writing fact files. They have investigated different sea creatures such as octopuses and sharks and used adjectives to describe their favourite sea creature. They also investigated their habitats, diets and other interesting facts. Year 1

are currently learning about the water cycle and exploring different lifeforms sustained by saltwater.



Year 2's Line of Enquiry is 'What makes Africa amazing?'

Year 2 have been deciding which African animal is the best out of a choice of 5! They worked in school and at home to research each animal and then presented their ideas on Family Friday. The result of the vote was that the black mamba was the best! We have also had a speaker in who gave us lots of information and answered our questions about South Africa. On 20<sup>th</sup> May, Year 2 will have some special animal visitors from Noah's Ark!






Year 3 's Line of Enquiry is 'Why should we care about the environment?'

In PSHE Year 3 have been considering the skills involved in being a good friend. They have presented their ideas to their classmates by drawing pictures, making posters and writing recipes for friendship. In computing we have been learning all about QR codes and exploring their uses. Year 3 have also been working enthusiastically to produce written reports on the rainforest for their own children's nature magazine in our Line of Enquiry; "Why should we care about the environment?" We have been studying the jungle art of Henri Rousseau and the children have started to produce some amazing drawings inspired by his paintings.










Year 4's Line of Enquiry is 'What's the most important thing about chocolate?'






Year 6's Line of Enquiry is 'How can life be celebrated through animations?'
