Key Knowledge

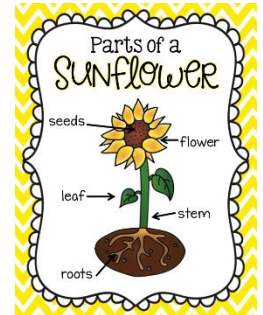
- Isambard Kingdom Brunel designed the Clifton Suspension Bridge.

- Bristol was the third city in England to have a public library. Libraries support local communities in many ways.
- Historical architecture, including places of worship, are key landmarks in and around Bristol.
- Maps use symbols to show natural and human features.
- Design, make, evaluate and improve a model, taking inspiration from historical designs such as Clifton Suspension Bridge.
- Design, make, evaluate and improve a moving model vehicle with axels and wheels, taking inspiration from Rolls Royce vehicles.

Country	Nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory
Capital	City or town that functions as the seat of government of a country
City	Large town
Town	Built-up area, larger than a village and smaller than a city
Village	Group of houses and buildings, smaller than a town, in a rural area
Natural Features	Something that exists from nature; not made or caused by humankind
Human Features	Something that is made or caused by humankind
Bridge	Structure carrying a road, path or railway across a river, road, or other obstacle
Mountain	Large steep hill
Gorge	Narrow valley between hills or mountains with steep rocky walls and a river
Port	Town or city with a harbour where ships load or unload
Dock	Enclosed area of water in a port for the loading, unloading, and repair of ships
River	Large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea
Direction	Course along which someone or something moves
Lifecycle	Series of changes in the life of an organism
Seeds	Unit of reproduction of a flowering plant
Flower	Seed-bearing part of a plant
Stem	Main body or stalk of a plant
Leaves	Main body or stalk of a plant
roots	Part of a plant which attaches it to the ground
