Sentence challenge!

A preposition is a word which shows the relationship between one thing and another. It may tell you where a thing is in relation to something else. E.g. The silver, shining bolt was on the door. It may tell you when something is in relation to another event. E.g. She refused to leave the room until she knew the coast was clear.

Is it possible to begin a sentence with a preposition? What punctuation may be needed in your sentence opener? Can you find the prepositions in the story start and your writing?

LO: To use colons to add detail.

A colon can be used to add some more information about something mentioned earlier in the sentence. For example:

He wanted just one thing: revenge.

She knew what her one wish would be: the ability to turn everything into gold.

Where could a colon be placed in these sentences? I decided it was time to leave I needed to avoid the evening traffic jam.

Iceman had only one weakness fire!




