The emperor penguin is the large of all the penguins; it is just over 1 metre tall and weighs around 30 kilograms. They have black heads, wings and feet and white bellies. They also have orange patches on their neck and faces. They have thick blubber underneath their skin which keeps them warm in the cold weather.

Emperor penguins live in harsh places near the seas in Antarctica. It is a very cold and windy place. Some winds can be as fast as 200 miles per hour. Because of this, penguins have waterproof feathers to keep dry and extra fat (blubber) to keep them warm. They live in big groups called flocks.



Their enemies are killer whales, leopard seals and sea lions.


fly. However, they can swim fast,

swimming at around 30 kilometres


per hour. They catch their food while they are swimming. They gather fish and squid in their beaks which they
