Road Safety

Barracks Lane can be a treacherous road in the morning, so let's make a real effort to be as safe as possible!

Covid Reporting Over the Holiday Period

Earlier in the week I sent an email detailing how to report Covid cases to the school from Saturday 19th December. You will be unable to contact the school by phone as you are used to, and it is essential that we still receive information about children who attend Nova that may show symptoms of COVID-19 so that we can inform test and trace and let any close contacts know of any self-isolation that they will need to complete, if symptoms develop less than 48 hours after last being in school. A member of the leadership team will be monitoring information provided by you. Please note that the government recommended isolation period has reduced from 14 days to 10 days. 

ABOVE & BEYOND WINNERS


