English and maths in Year 2 and 6 (SATs). Some of you have asked about this so I will briefly explain how assessment will work as a result.

Over the next few weeks, teachers will be carrying out a variety of assessment activities to ascertain children's attainment and to plan their next steps. This may involve the following, depending on the age of the children:

- Reading assessments with the teacher or TA
- Maths Fluency pre and post assessments so teaching is pitched perfectly
- End of term tests in reading, spelling/grammar and maths
- Day-to-day observation of each child's learning
- Quizzes and fun chances to show knowledge

Whatever programme of assessment the children have, the main aim is to accelerate their learning and ensure any gaps caused by lockdown are filled as soon as possible.

You will shortly receive details about booking a parent consultation with your child's teacher for the start of term 5 and you will be able to discuss how your child is progressing at this time. At the end of the school year you will receive a report as you always do and this will inform you of

Year 3



To continue their topic of The Rainforest, Year 3 have been reading a set of instructions called 'How to Catch a Tree Frog!' They wanted to practice what they had learnt from the text even though they didn't expect to really find anything and LOOK what they returned with! Year 3 are now the proud owners of 23 Tree Frogs!

They have been very busy building permanent enclosures in the classroom and learning more about what amphibians need to survive. The Tree Frogs have even joined in with some of their lessons!



Year 4

In Year 4 during art this week we have been demonstrating space and perspective in a self portrait. We built up our self portraits using perspective lines to guide us where features should be. We added details from that point and will go on to produce portraits in different mediums. We also made posters to encourage us to have a positive day as part of our SMILE activities.



Year 5

Term 4 got off to a flying start with children in year 5 producing stunning reports on The Olympic Games, which began 2700 years ago in Ancient Greece. Children in school, and at home, were so creative with the presentation of their research: lift-the-flap fact files, posters and beautifully set out reports using a wide variety of computing skills.



Year 6

Year 6 had a great launch day, introducing the next part of our Line of Enquiry: Natural Disasters. This will allow us to continue answering: How did Earth Evolve? We made earthquake-proof buildings, created tornadoes using shading and varied the temperature of water to create physical reactions like in a volcano!

Each day, classes looked at a different SMILE letter and completed activities and games supporting their understanding. It was brilliant to see children learning about all the ways they can look after their mental health and wellbeing, from learning new skills to mindfulness meditations!


Payment MUST be made in advance using school gateway which is the same link as for dinner money and trip payments:
