






Year 1 have had a super term 4, they have particularly enjoyed being designers and scientists. The children researched various puppet types and different materials,

Year 3

This term, our Year 3 children have been working incredibly hard as Engineers within Design and Technology. They have applied their scientific knowledge about forces, magnets and electrical circuits to create their very own games. These games took inspiration from magnetic mazes and buzz wire games. The children also designed rectangular-shaped bases and used diagonal struts to strengthen its vulnerable points. You can see pictures of our engineers during the 'making' and 'refining' process. All Year 3 children were very excited to invite Year 3 parent/carers in at the end of term to play our games.









Well done to Year 4! Our Line of Enquiry focussing on STEM skills finished with an exciting car race. The children have become expert engineers developing so many Design and Technology and Science skills along the way. Resilience has been built through the last two very challenging weeks where they have sawed, glued, adjusted, fixed circuits, pulleys and axles and so much more! We can't wait to see what you achieve in terms 5 and 6!









Year 5 had a great visit to Bristol Museum last week! Our Ancient Greek workshop was so informative and we absolutely loved sketching our favourites from the Grayson Perry Show. In our D&T lessons, we have been designing and making Greek inspired dips and pitta bread. Very yummy!

SCIENCE WEEK


Science week this year was a huge success! The Theme was 'Growth' and all children across the school enjoyed learning about a new or exciting science concept

Well done to everyone who took part. What amazing scientists you have all become!








EXPRESS YOURSELF WEEK
