EYFS

Our topic in Reception this term is 'Ticket to Ride' . We have been learning all about journeys and different types of transport. We created our own Travel Agents and the children have enjoyed searching for holidays, writing packing lists and booking flights! Outside we created different vehicles from junk modelling and even created a bus and bus stop.









Year 1 have loved being scientists this term. We have learnt about the structure of a plant and how plants grow as well as identifying a range of common and wild garden plants. We also explored the school grounds looking for deciduous and evergreen trees and particularly enjoyed examining the leaves to help us name some of the trees that we saw on our hunt.









Year 2

In Year 2 we have been participating in African drumming lessons this half term to support our line of enquiry question, "What makes Africa amazing?". We can't wait to perform to parents and carers in term 6!









Year 3

The children in Year 3 were very excited to embark on their new Line of Enquiry, "Why should we care about the environment?". As part of their geographical enquiry, children have posed research questions and begun gathering data. They have located the position of the equator and explored how this affects climate. The

children are now collecting local temperature and rainfall data and comparing this against the weather experienced in the Amazon Rainforest.

Year 3 children have also been engaged in persuasive writing. They have researched facts about one of their favourite South American animals, the iguana, and created a persuasive text which includes a contradictory argument where "no parents/ carers could possibly object to them owning one!"


To top off all this excitement, the Year 3 children have begun Orienteering (OAA) as part of the PE curriculum. They are developing problem solving skills through a range of challenges as well as learning to orientate a map, identify key symbols and follow routes.







Year 4 have been working hard as digital engineers this term. We have been learning how to input algorithms using a text-based programming app called Logo. So far, the children have written, tested and debugged codes to draw their initials and a square. Keep up the fantastic work year 4!



Year 5 are busy being engineers this week. We are creating mechanisms for our Earth in space models. Plus, another fabulous home learning model. The sky's the limit!





Our super Year 6 pupils have worked incredibly hard this year. To relax together before SATs week, we enjoyed a visit from a local ice-cream van! The Year 6 team are incredibly proud of everyone; pupils have had a mature, positive attitude and supported each other brilliantly. Bring on AirHop!

We would like to warmly invite you to join us for a **Coffee Morning** on **Wednesday**25th May 9.00am - 10.30am.


This will be our first Coffee Morning following the COVID pandemics and lockdowns, and we are thoroughly excited to open the school again to parents and carers.



NEW COMMUNICATION SYSTEM

Over the past week you will have received information concerning our new communication, booking and payments system 'Weduc'.

Initially we have just set up the bookings for breakfast club and Nova ASC, and hope to transfer any existing bookings and payments to the new system shortly, but please continue to contact the school office to amend existing or make additional

bookings for either of these clubs so that we can iron out any inevitable teething problems.

Please note that, on the Weduc systems, bookings for Nova ASC will not be confirmed without payment, but you can still use childcare vouchers to pay.

By term 6 the Weduc system should be fully operational which will include the ability to book your child's school dinners and (if applicable) make school dinner payments.

You will receive instructions on downloading the Weduc app, and the web address, along with your individual enrol code in a separate email.

Please bear with us as we also get to grips with 'Weduc' and watch out for future information.





AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

The cost of the club is £6.50 per session and term 5 is available for you to book online. Please note that only children who have booked into after school club can attend. Booking Procedure

To enrol for Nova's After School Club, please complete and return a registration form which can be obtained from the School Office.

Alternatively, if you require a space at short notice, please call the office and we will be able to book you in, subject to availability.

As spaces are limited, you must book in advance and we ask that you notify us by 3pm if your child is not able to attend that day, although refunds will only be given if we receive 2 working days' notice of cancellation.

As mentioned above, we will shortly be launching our new communication/payment/booking system 'Weduc' so look out for your enrolment email. The after school club and breakfast club bookings for term 6 will be available to book via Weduc by the end of this term.
