### EYFS

This term in Wallace and Gromit class our Topic is 'Fantastic Food'. We have been learning the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and have enjoyed making puppets and acting out the story, writing from the perspectives of different characters

Year 2 have been busy working on their African textile skills and tried out weaving for themselves.









The children in Year 3 have settled into term 6 with gusto! In English, the children were dazzled by giants and devised their very own questions for a 'world-renowned giant expert'. They collaborated to establish a writer's toolkit and are now working to innovate a non-fiction report on giants.

In Maths, children are learning to tell the time to the minute on an analogue clock as well as to calculate duration. You may like to create a daily or weekly timetable with your child showing what activities they complete at what times and how long each takes.



We now look forward to becoming master chocolatiers and inviting parents in for a taste test that will inform the evaluation stage of our D&T food project and allow us to refine our recipes.

Year 5 have enjoyed a busy start to our final term of the school year: team building in PE, sketching skills in Art and making a water cycle in a box in our Geography lessons. # PARENT/CARER COFFEE MORNING


# On the 25<sup>th</sup> May we were happy to welcome parent/carers again to our school for a coffee morning!

#### **Booking Procedure**

To enrol for Nova's After School Club, please complete and return a registration form which can be obtained from the School Office.

To book, just go to the payments area of Weduc and click on 'bookings available', Nova ASC Term 6 and then select the dates required and add to your basket and then checkout.

You will have been sent your login details for Weduc in a separate email and you will need to have added funds to your 'purse' before being able to book ASC.

Alternatively, if you require a space at short notice, please call the office and we will be able to book you in, subject to availability.

As spaces are limited, you must book in advance and we ask that you notify us by 3pm if your child is not able to attend that day, although refunds will only be given if we receive 2 working days' notice of cancellation.
