# SAFE USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA, GAMING & ENTERTAINMENT FOR CHILDREN

Being online is now an integral part of children and young people's lives. The internet and online technology provide new opportunities for young people's learning and growth, but it can also expose them to new types of risks.

Recently, we have noticed an increase in young children discussing, watching or playing elements of social media and entertainment that are not suitable for their corresponding ages.

Age ratings are systems used to ensure that entertainment content, such as games, films, TV shows or social media platforms are clearly labelled with a minimum age recommendation based on the content they have. The age rating considers the age suitability of a game, film or social media platform, not the level of difficulty or necessary skills required to use it.

Long-time media scholars, Brad Bushman and Rowell Huesmann (2012), summarise how and why media, such as gaming and films, may influence violent behaviour this way:

"Children who watch violent movies and TV or who play violent video games imitate the aggressive scripts they see; become more condoning of violence, start to believe the world is a more hostile place, become emotionally desensitised to violence, and lose empathy for victims. The violence they see justifies to them their own violent acts; the violence they see arouses them; and the violence they see cues aggressive ideas for them."

We wanted to bring to your attention the age rating of some of the following types of

Media. Please carefully consider the appropriateness of allowing your children to use and access them:



You must be <u>a minimum of 13 years of age</u> to use any of the above social media outlets. This will be linked with the content and advertising that they may be subjected to, as well as the online safety dangers that are involved in using social media platforms.



The content within this game is **only suitable to children aged 7 and over.** PEGI 7 games may have scenes or sounds that can possibly be frightening to younger children. They also include very mild forms of violence e.g. implied, non-detailed, or non-realistic violence



The content within this game is **only suitable to children aged 12 and over**. Despite the cartoon nature of the game, the aim is to kill every other person in the game. If your child is under 12 and you allow them to play this game, you should monitor them whilst playing to ensure you are able to manage their response to the content. PEGI 12 games include violence of a slightly more graphic nature towards fantasy characters or non-realistic violence towards human-like characters. Sexual innuendo or sexual posturing can be present, while any bad language in this category must be mild.



The content within this game is **only suitable to** <u>adults</u> aged 18 and over. The adult classification is applied when the level of violence reaches a stage where it becomes a depiction of gross violence, apparently motiveless killing, or violence towards defenceless characters, also the glamorisation of the use of illegal drugs and of the simulation of gambling. Explicit sexual activity also falls into this age category.

Please check the PEGI age rating of any game, so that you can make an informed decision as to whether it is suitable and appropriate for your child to be playing it. You can find more information about PEGI age ratings here: <a href="http://www.pegi.info">www.pegi.info</a>

When deciding on whether an age restricted game is suitable for your child, you may want to think about whether you would allow your child to watch a 12-rated movie, or an 18-rated movie, as the content is very similar.

In regards to film and television, you can find information on the different age ratings and classifications here: <u>https://www.bbfc.co.uk/about-</u> <u>classification/classification-guidelines</u>. It is worth using these guidelines to inform your decision on whether your child should watch a certain film or TV show, and whether it is appropriate for them to watch a film or TV show even with you accompanying them or being present.

### TALK PANTS

Talk PANTS – a campaign created by the NSPCC – helps children understand that their body belongs to them, and they should tell someone they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried.

#### **Booking Procedure**

To enrol for Nova's After School Club, please complete and return a registration form which can be obtained from the School Office.

To book, just go to the payments area of Weduc and click on 'bookings available', Nova ASC Term 1 and then select the dates required and add to your basket and then checkout.

You will have been sent your login details for Weduc in a separate email and you will need to have added funds to your 'purse' before being able to book ASC.

Alternatively, if you require a space at short notice, please call the office and we will be able to book you in, subject to availability.

As spaces are limited, you must book in advance and we ask that you notify us by 3pm if your child is not able to attend that day, although refunds will only be given if we receive 2 working days' notice of cancellation.
