Year 1

Year One have had a fantastic few weeks settling into Key Stage One! We have been enjoying playing and learning inside and out alongside our friends. We have been learning more about each other in circle times for PSHE and about keeping a pulse and creating rhythms in music with Miss Harris.









Year 2 have been immersed in the Lighthouse Keepers Lunch story.

We have become authors and have begun planning our story innovation. First, we designed our own Mr Grinling characters, choosing his new job role and used adjectives to describe his appearance and personality. Next, we created our own story map to retell the story of who stole Mr Grinling's lunch!

We are excited to see the brilliant stories Year 2 will write from their story maps.



Year 3 have had an awesome start to term 1. As well as settling into their new routines, the children have made an incredible effort to impress us, with their enthusiasm for our new Line of Enquiry 'Would you rather live in stone age Britain or Ancient Egypt?'

As mathematicians, the children have explored place value within 1,000 where they have learnt to flexibly partition numbers as well as to represent numbers on a place value chart using Dienes and place value counters.

As authors, we have been learning the story, with actions, to this term's journey text 'Amisi and the Fig' where we have focused on learning new vocabulary, and how to use inverted commas to show direct speech. In addition, we have enjoyed reading our class text 'Stig of the Dump' each day.







Year 4 have been working hard as Historians exploring their first Line of Enquiry 'Who were the Romans and what was their legacy on Britain?'

We have been intrigued by what life may have been like in Roman times and really enjoyed exploring a variety of sources to gather evidence about Roman lives. What an amazing range of questions asked by so many curious children!





Year 5 have enjoyed a wide range of creative, interactive and challenging activities over the first few weeks of term: spreading kindness with our recycled plant pot violas, building paper towers, creating human timelines and reading and responding to 'The Invisible'.

We are now well in to our first Talk For Writing unit – an action-filled tale based on Nyangara the Fire Python. We can't wait to get innovating our own stories next week!

Also this week as athletes we continued learning how to play volley ball, and developed our skills using the "dig" shot. Keep up the amazing work everyone!









The children in Year 6 have settled into Term 1 maturely and with great enthusiasm. We have appointed a number of prefects who proudly exhibited their oracy skills when delivering considerate speeches. We are confident that they will be brilliant role-models for our school community!

In English, the children were intrigued by a WW2 evacuee suitcase and devised many interesting questions to infer who the mystery owner might be. They collaborated well to establish a writer's toolkit and are now working to innovate a fictional portal story.


In Maths, children are recapping their place value knowledge while displaying increasing confidence in calculating numbers up to 10,000,000!


It has been a fantastic start to the year and we look forward to the challenges ahead!







MEET THE TEAM



The best part of the role:

As Learning Mentor and Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) I have the rewarding and privileged opportunity to work together with pupils to improve emotional intelligence, mental health and well-being. In return I see pupils taking on the knowledge and skills to actively support themselves in being able to manage their own mental health, well-being and positivity at school, home and community.

Hobbies:

I have a keen interest in arts and crafts, sensory and messy play. I enjoy kayaking, mountain biking, walking and travelling in my camper van round UK and Europe. To relax I often take timeout gardening, cooking, listening to music and watching old familiar films.

Experience:

I have 25 years' experience working with young people of all ages in varying educational and social care settings. I have for the last 8 years worked primarily in education settings. These have included SEN needs, Pupil Referral Units and mainstream settings from primary to higher education. More recently I have been trained and practising ELSA for 3 years, while adding several other therapeutic interventions to my tool box, to better support the young people I work with.

WHAT IS AN ELSA?



Janet and Mark have both been trained by Educational Psychologists to become ELSAs.

ELSAs help children and young people to understand their emotions and respect the feelings of those around them. They aim to establish a warm, respectful relationship with a child, providing a consistent private space, time and opportunity for children to think about their personal circumstances. They are not there to fix a child's problems but to support them in using strategies to better enable them to self-manage their feelings

The majority of ELSA work is delivered on an individual basis, but sometimes small group work is more appropriate, especially in the areas of social and friendship skills.

In ELSA we aim to provide support for a wide range of emotional needs: Recognising emotions Self-esteem Social skills Friendship skills Anger management Loss and Bereavement

Children are usually referred for ELSA support by their class teacher, Senior Leaders or by parent's request. Referrals are discussed and prioritised accordingly with support sessions planned to facilitate the pupil in developing new skills and coping strategies that allow them to manage social and emotional demands more effectively.

It needs to be appreciated that change cannot necessarily be achieved rapidly and is

dependent upon the context and complexity of the presenting issues. Children with complex or long-term needs will not resolve all their difficulties through ELSA sessions, however support will be designed to target specific aspects of a child's need.
