1 Rationale

Home learning is recognised as an essential part of a child's education by our school community. When planned carefully, it engages families in the learning process and encourages motivation and independence in young people.

At Nova Primary, we have listened to families and teachers and have devised a system which is purposeful and manageable for all.

Please read in conjunction with calculation and spelling policies.

2. Purposes

- To further children's academic progress in all areas.
- To give children the opportunity to consolidate and practise what they
 have learned at school with a particular focus on key skills such as reading, spelling
 and number fluency.
- To engage and involve families in children's learning.
- To prepare children with the learning behaviours and attitudes needed for their future education.

3. Practices

- We believe home learning tasks should focus on helping children consolidate their key skills in reading, spelling and maths fluency practice through regular practise at home.
- We provide a range of reading books for all children to take home to read. Children have the opportunity to change their reading books at least 2x weekly. Children reading longer chapter books may change their books less frequently.
- Children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 (until Christmas) are taught phonics. Videos for parents and carers are available on our school website showing pronunciations of sounds.
- Children in Y2-Y6 all have Spelling Shed accounts where they can practise their spellings online. Children are also provided with printed spelling lists and a home-learning journal to practise writing their spellings at home.
- For children in Y2-Y6 we provide digital Times Table Rockstar accounts so that they can practise their fluency skills. We teach children to chant their timetables saying the smaller factor first e.g.
 - $2 \times 3 = 6$ would be chanted as 'two threes are six'
 - $3 \times 2 = 6$ would be chanted as 'two threes are six'
 - $6 \div 2 = 3$ would be chanted as Teacher 'six divided by 2 is', pupils reply 'two threes are six'
- Year 6 pupils are provided with booklets with additional focused SPAG/ number home learning work to complete each week.
- We also provide a suggested optional list of practical, creative or research-based termly tasks linked to our wider curriculum. These are available on our school website. There

is also an option for children to innovate by engaging in an activity or learning something that is not on the standard menu.

4. School Holidays

At Nova Primary, we recognise that school holidays are sacred and not every family wants lots of tasks to complete. However, some parents and children do request activities. During the holidays, we encourage children to continue reading and they also have the option of completing activities from the wider curriculum list. In Year 6, there may be additional tasks to prepare for statutory assessments administered in May (SATS).

We believe children learn from experiences and where possible encourage families to attend day trips, watch documentaries and read books together linked to the curriculum or children's own interests.

5. Pupils with Special Educational Needs

We set homework for all children as a normal part of school life. We ensure that all tasks set are appropriate to the ability of the child. If a child has special needs we endeavour to adapt any task set so that all children can contribute in a positive way.

6. The Role of Parents and Carers

Parents have been consulted in order for this policy to be written. Some parents value home learning more than others, and we acknowledge that it can be tricky for those who work long hours or in larger families. Homework is not a legal requirement and children will not be penalised if they have not completed it. Nevertheless, we encourage parents and carers to do the following:

- Ensure **reading** is a **non-negotiable**.
- Ensure children regularly practise their spelling and maths fluency skills at home.
- Provide a quiet, comfortable space for children to complete tasks.
- Praise and recognise effort in home learning.
- Use your talents and experiences to enhance children's learning at home. Children will benefit greatly from what parents and carers can show them, discuss with them and teach them.
- Contact the teacher as soon as possible if you have a query.

7. The Role of Teachers

Primarily, teachers are responsible for ensuring home learning is appropriate and helps children consolidate their key learning skills. Parents and children appreciate feedback and where deserved praise.

Teachers at Nova Primary:

- Provide resources and tasks for children to consolidate and build upon their key reading, spelling and numeracy skills at home.
- Provide information and helpful training sessions for parents and carers to give them confidence to support their child.
- Check reading logs weekly, acknowledging verbally those who read regularly.
- Monitor home learning tasks being completed by children.
- Encourage and support children with their home learning.
- Celebrate children's successes and development, including academic and personal achievements.

8. Monitoring and Review

The governing body is responsible for monitoring this policy at appropriate intervals. A review of this programme of home learning will be carried out after it has run for two terms, and thereafter as part of the Autumn term parent questionnaire.
